### **WHAT** is Erasmus+?

Is a European funding programme established in 1987 offering university students a possibility of studying or doing an internship in another country for a period of at least 2 months and maximum 12 months per cycle of studies. Erasmus+ now offers the possibility to go way beyond the European borders as well.



### **WHY Erasmus+?**


- Have you ever wanted to live abroad and experience a foreign culture, meet new people and learn a foreign language?
- Have you ever thought about enriching the period of your studies and having better chances while looking for a job in the future?
- Have you ever been excited to share your ideas and to create good things with other students from all around the world?
- Have you ever dreamed of do an internship abroad, to learn cooperative work?
- Have you ever heard that life won't be the same after Erasmus?



### WHO can apply for?

Higher education **Bachelor degree** students from after completing the **1st year of studies** can benefit from the Erasmus+ studies and Erasmus+ placement programmes.

Higher education Master degree and PhD students from the 1st semester of studies. There is no age limitation.

### WHERE can you apply to?

Each student receives a grant which covers partly the costs of the stay abroad. Grants differ from host countries.

USB is required to make the amount of the grant publicly known to students, so the scholarship can be just found <a href="https://example.com/here">here.</a>

# With the support of the Erasmus+ Programme of the European Union



Students going on exchange under the ERASMUS+ programme pay the tuition fees at USB.

You should be aware that in most cases, the Erasmus+ grant alone will not cover all your living expenses.

### **Administrative duty**

One of the basic rights each exchange student has is the full recognition of courses passed successfully abroad by EF JU!

Before leaving the USB, you have to sign the **Learning Agreement** - a document that describes the programme of studies followed in the host university.

At the end of the stay, the host university should prepare for you a document called **Transcript of Records (TOR)**, which confirms the completed studies' programme and the results of your examination. Should you face problems in recognition, you can seek the help of <u>International Office FE</u> to make your courses validated.

Also, you have to bring from the host uni an **original** of the **Confirmation of study period (CSP)**. The period of stay stated in the confirmation should agree with the period specified in the Grant Agreement; this is the period for which you draw the awarded scholarship if the actual length of the student's stay abroad *confirmed by the foreign university* is shorter than the originally set period, the student is obliged to return a proportional part of the scholarship for each unused day.

Fill in the **Participant report** of the study stay, which you will receive automatically after your stay.

## Language?

Studying or working in another European country under Erasmus+ is a great opportunity to develop your skills. Your mobility is not supposed to be only in English, but in language, that is not your native.

We offer a language course for international students. You will be register on the <u>Erasmus+ Online Linguistic Support</u> website, and you will be able to take online courses. You may be entitled to receive online linguistic support for certain languages, such as German, Spanish, French, Italian, etc. and may be able to get additional support, either before you go or during your stay at the host institution.



### **Preparation?**



- Submit an application for a selection procedure at the faculty of Economics in January. The results will be available in February.
- **Nomination from FE USB.** We will notify the foreign university of the names of the selected students and contact details. Based on this information, the student will be contacted by the coordinator of the foreign university. The coordinator will provide him with the necessary information on what needs to be arranged before arriving at the foreign university.
- Preparation of documents. Selected students fill in (preferably electronically) the necessary forms required by JU and a foreign
  university.

Each student himself monitors requirements for the admission of foreign students, forms, special requirements, and deadlines for submitting an application to a foreign university.

In any case you should start planning your Erasmus+ stay at least 6 months in advance!
