\*\* Outputs can be repeated, but are counted only once.

\*\*\* If several authors collaborate on a chapter, the number of credits is divided according to the student's percentage share of authorship of the chapter. This means that the final number of credits a student receives for a chapter is calculated as 10 credits multiplied by their share of authorship.

***As part of study requirements, students publish at least one output in English in journals with a non-zero impact factor. To fulfill the number of credits, it is also necessary to publish in journals in the WoS or Scopus database. For each publication that students list as an output within their doctoral studies, their authorship share will be stated in %, so that the sum of all authorship shares equals 100 %. The student must be listed as the first author for one of the publications. All of these publications must be thematically related to the dissertation.***
